The Global Timber Tracking Network promotes the operationalization of innovative tools for wood identification and origin determination, to assist the fight against illegal logging and related trade around the globe.

The GTTN network of service providers can contribute to enforcing **REDD+**, by offering tools to safeguard the implementation of forest management and forest protection objectives.

A scientific proof of tree species and geographic origin of a wood product, can help determining whether wood originated from places where logging was allowed, or not, e.g. from outside a forest concession zone.

This is possible by holistic application of methods involving e.g. wood anatomy, genetics, isotopic measurements and mass spectrometry.

This allows trading in confidence that tree species and origin match expectations.


